

Universal childcare credit

- For working families claiming Universal Credit, in England,
 Scotland, and Wales.
- Eligibility criteria apply.
- Both parents working unless one of the allowable exceptions is met.
- With children usually under 17 (including children with a disability).
- Up to 85% of eligible childcare costs can be reclaimed.
- Upfront support is available to fund the first month's payment.
- Can be accessed through registered providers or childminders.



How Universal Credit Childcare works

If you pay for childcare while you go to work, Universal Credit can pay some of your childcare costs.



You can get **up to 85% of childcare costs** paid back to you.

The maximum amount a month is:

- £1,014.63 for one child
- . £1,739.37 for two or more children

You might also be able to get help with your initial upfront childcare costs.

2 Eligibility

You need to be either:

- In paid work
- · Starting a job in the next month

If you live with a partner, you both need to be in paid work, unless your partner cannot look after your children.

3 What the costs can cover

Your childcare must be with **registered childcare providers**.

Usually that means they are registered with OFSTED, the Care Inspectorate in Scotland or the Care Inspectorate Wales.

Universal Credit

- Parents/carers pay for childcare costs.
- Then report them to Universal Credit, and Universal Credit pays some of the money back.
- Parents/carers will only get the money back with Universal Credit after the childcare happens.
- If childcare is paid after it's been provided, the costs will be paid back in the same month that they are reported.
- Proof of childcare provider and payments is required.



Tax-Free Childcare

For working families, including the self-employed, in the UK

Earning under £100k and at least £183 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage) each

For children aged 0-11 or until 16 if the child has a disability.

For parents who aren't receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit or childcare vouchers

For every £8 a parent pays into an online account, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year-or £4,000 each year if the child has a disability.

- Digital by default service.

- TFC accounts are for each child not per household.
- Top up is per child not per household.
- Parents must confirm their details are up to date every three months.



TFC is not just about under 5s and childcare...

Private, voluntary and school run wraparound care before or after school clubs

How to use Tax-Free Childcare

For every £8 you pay in, the government will automatically add £2, up to the value of £2,000 per child per year (or £4,000 for disabled children).

1 Check you're eligible

You can't use Tax-Free Childcare together with Tax Credits, Universal Credit Childcare or Childcare Vouchers.

Find out if you are eligible

4 Pay money into your Childcare Account

You can deposit money into your childcare account using a debit card, but it's quicker by standing order or bank transfer. We'll add the government top up automatically and you can use this money when it shows as 'available'.

2 Apply for Tax-Free Childcare

If eligible, you'll get an online childcare account.

Apply for Tax-Free Childcare

5 Pay your childcare provider(s)

Use the money in your childcare account, including the government top up, to make one off or regular payments to your childcare provider(s).

3 Select your childcare provider(s)

Your childcare provider(s) must sign up to receive Tax-Free Childcare payments.

6 Reconfirm

To continue getting the government top-up, you must confirm your details are up to date every **3 months**.

You will receive a reminder to do this.

Providers - signing up and using TFC

How to sign up to TFC

- Register with a regulator
- Regulator forwards information to HMRC.
- A letter is generally issued within approximately 15 days.
- Registration letters can only be sent direct to the childcare setting and not an alternative address.
- Lost ID numbers Please call the childcare service helpline on 0300 123 4097.


Once providers have signed up for TFC

Providers can:

- Accept TFC payments and get a childcare provider account which is used to keep details up to date
- Manage payments online 24/7 (using the provider account)
- Delegate access to someone else to manage it.
- Promote the financial benefits to customers
- Continue to accept payments from parents using childcare vouchers and other methods

Why providers should know about TFC and other childcare support





Supports providers with increasing fee structures and income generation.

Some parents will specifically search for providers registered for TFC to benefit from the scheme when looking for childcare.

TFC and UC can be used for upfront costs and retainers.

Parents can use to pay for additional childcare costs above funded hours (Early Years).

Parents can save TFC across the year to reduce holiday childcare costs.



Tax-Free Childcare

Tax-Free Childcare is a UK wide offer. Eligible working parents with children 11 or under can get up to £2,000 per child, per year, towards their childcare costs (or up to £4,000 for disabled children 16 or under).

You will only be able to receive Tax-Free Childcare payments from your customers if you've signed up to Tax-Free Childcare.

Learn about Tax-Fee Childcare

30 hours free childcare

30 hours childcare is available to eligible working families of 3 and 4 year olds in England. This is an additional 15 hours on top of the 15 hours available to all parents of three and four year olds. Just like the 15 hours entitlement, you do not have to offer 30 hours childcare.

From April 2024, even more eligible working parents in England will be eligible to get help with their childcare costs.





Sample social media posts: Universal Credit Childcare

Once childcare providers have registered with the relevant regulator, working parents on Universal Credit can claim back up to 85% of their childcare costs and receive as much as £1,015 per month for one child or £1,739 for two or more children. There is support available for parents who might need it to pay their costs upfront. 




NEW: Sample social media posts: Wraparound Childcare

Help us to inform parents that before and after school childcare, also known as **wraparound childcare**, is expanding for primary school age children in England and that they have the right to request it. They can do so in writing to their child's school, be it by letter or e-mail via school-run parent survey. To find out more about their wraparound options, **parents can talk to their child's school or the Family Information Service in their local authority.**

From September, even more parents of primary school children in England will be able to access before and after-school childcare such as regular provision that runs between 8am and 6pm or later.

If eligible, you can use Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare to help pay for wraparound childcare.

To support more working families, from September, parents of primary school children in England can expect to see an increase in wraparound childcare.

This includes regular before and after school provision that run from 8am until 6pm or later, either on a school site or at another local setting.

Using the learning from what has worked:

- Ensure TFC and childcare support is included in strategic plans for wrap-around childcare and the early years entitlements.
- Use the communication routes that work locally.
- Use the Childcare Choices resources.
- Differentiate messages so they are understood and relevant to the audience.
- Share information in bitesize/usable sections rather than sending in their entirety.
- Drip feed information keep childcare support on the agenda by repeating messages and information.
- Ensure providers know where to signpost parents if they need specialist advice – Welfare teams, Employers for Childcare etc.
- Review and refresh information on websites, the Family Information Service, social media and digital platforms regularly.
- Support providers to see the childcare support as an integral part
 of their business plan and ensure providers understand how
 childcare support can help them with business sustainability.
