Infection Prevention Control – Gloves Off Webinar

IPC audits of care home settings have highlighted variations in adherence to the "<u>Five Moments of Hand Hygiene</u>". Audits have identified that non-sterile gloves are often used when not needed, put on too early, taken off too late or not changed at critical points increasing the risk of spreading infections.

This webinar looks at reducing the unnecessary use of non-sterile gloves, their correct use, when to wear them and when not. The webinar also looks at the impact of the NHS Gloves Off Campaign including the cost savings for organisations, the positive impact in terms of environmental sustainability and its application to Adult Social Care Settings.

Healthy Living Toolkits

A new set of healthy living toolkits developed by the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland (LLR) Learning Disabilities and Autism (LDA) Collaborative, aim to address longstanding health inequalities and improve outcomes for people with learning disabilities through better nutrition, hydration and physical activity. Research shows that people with learning disabilities are significantly more likely to experience health conditions which are linked to factors such as poor nutrition and low levels of physical activity. In Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland, more than one-in-ten (11%) of people with a learning disability are underweight, while one-in-three (33%) are living with obesity.

The resources highlight the importance of inclusive community facilities, such as the availability of wheelchair-accessible scales, to ensure accurate health monitoring for all.
