

Get Streetwise – Protecting the Future You

Year 9 Lesson

Teacher's Notes

This lesson revolves around the consequences of pupils' choices, when travelling independently, on: their family; their friends; their futures. The lesson should take 45-minutes to an hour to complete.

Time Window Activity

The Time Window Activity should take roughly 15-20 minutes to complete. In the lesson packs, there are three Time Window worksheets. These should be printed out on A3 paper. Each worksheet looks at an event from slide 11 (slide 11 to be kept onscreen throughout the activity).

The point of the activity is to get pupils thinking about the varying longer-term impacts of collisions. Each worksheet has three characters, who have been impacted by one the events described on slide 11. Pupils will then chart, by jotting down notes on the worksheet, how this affects these characters over a period of ten years

During the lesson, the class should be divided up. This can be done multiple ways, according to teacher preference. You could, however, split the class into:

- Threes – give each group of three a worksheet. Pupils can then map out the consequences on their character.
- Sixes – give each group of six a worksheet. Pupils can then map out the consequences on their characters, in pairs.
- Tables – give each table a worksheet. Pupils can then decide who fills out which sections.

Some groups to be called up at the end of the activity to present their ideas/worksheet.
