

The Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) and supporting Looked After Children

The EYPP will be available from April 2015 for eligible 3 and 4 year olds accessing funded early education. It supplies up to an additional £300 for children accessing their funded place.

The EYPP will provide the nursery, pre-school or child minder with extra funding to enhance the opportunities, support and experiences offered as part of the child's early education.

Looked After Children will be eligible for this additional funding.

The Local Authority (LA) is responsible for ensuring that Looked After Children in a nursery/pre-school/childminder provision make progress and that their individual learning and development needs are met. If you have a Looked After Child in your provision the LA will

- organise a meeting with the provider, social worker, foster carer/s and others as appropriate to develop a Personal Education Plan (PEP) for the child, this will also include how the EYPP funding will be spent to support the child's learning and development
- arrange for an Improvement Advisor to support the implementation of the PEP by providing monthly support visits.
- monitor the impact the EYPP funding has had on the learning and development of the child
