Dr Tina Rae has over 30 years' experience working with children, adults and families in both clinical and educational contexts within local authorities and specialist educational services. Also a prolific author, Tina specialises in social, emotional and mental health difficulties in children and young people.

Dylan is well known to AOS and has been delivering presentations about his life to parents for the last 4 years. Workshop A: Emotion Coaching – Dr Tina Rae

In this workshop Tina will initially introduce the concept of emotional Literacy and will then proceed to present Gottman's Emotion Coaching philosophy and practices as a means of developing positive relationships with children and young people. Learning How to Emotion Coach will therefore be a key focus of the session.

Workshop B: Sensory Strategies for EY children with ASD - AOS EY Staff
