Course Content

Children's services is a diverse sector and the MA in Early Childhood Studies offers a specialist programme that will attract those employed in early years, foundation and primary sectors including: owner/ managers from the private, voluntary and independent sector. In addition, this programme will support the progression needs of those working in wider children's services in health or education.

The programme will provide a broad base of topic areas that will enable you to develop your ability to critically reflect and evaluate your own practice from an informed professional perspective.

You will study a suite of modules that focuses on the safeguarding and protection of children from the pressures and influences of modern day society. In addition, you will identify current influences that are shaping policy and informing practice locally, nationally and globally. The relationship between the politics of knowledge and the social constructions of teaching and learning are explored. It will also develop enhanced awareness of macro, micro and international contemporary issues in order to clarify and determine priorities for innovative and enterprising projects within early childhood.
