SEND - Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

CoP – Code of Practice - the document was first published in September 2014 and then updated in January 2015. The DFE produced a shortened version of the <u>Code of</u> <u>Practice for the Early Years 0-5</u>.

SENDSP - SEND Support Plan – This document gives a wholistic view of a child's strengths and needs and is drawn up in consultation with the child, family and all professionals involved in the child's education and care. The SEND Support Plan can be used to apply for Top-up funding for school if submitted to, and approved by SENA, and to request a statutory assessment for an Education Health and Care Plan. In both cases schools are expected to meet the first 15 hours of support from their SEND budget. The SEND support plan can also be used to support a child's transition to school where the criteria for Top-up Funding or statutory assessment will not be met.

Inclusion Funding – this funding is used to support children with significant and complex needs who attend early years' settings. 2-year olds are eligible for Inclusion Funding if they are in receipt of 2 year funding or they receive Disability Living Allowance (DLA). Panels take place twice a term. SENCos are required to give information about what support has already been provided by the setting and what the funding will be used for. The outcome of the panels is communicated via anycomms.

Local Offer – The Local Offer has information for parents about services they can access. All providers are required to contribute to the Local Offer by detailing their approach to supporting children with SEND and what experience and facilities are available in the setting. OPP - One Page Profile - This is the first section of a SENDSP and it emphasises the person-centred approach to supporting children. Parents record their child's views, interests, hopes and wishes for the future in a personalised format.

EHCP – Education, Health and Care Plan - From September 2014, the EHCP replaced statements of special educational needs for children or young people. EHCPs now covers 0-25-year olds. The purpose of the plan is to provide a co-ordinated process for children and young people with the most complex arrangements across education, health and social care services. To access a

specialist provision or school, an EHCP must be in place naming the school. The EHCP must be formally reviewed annually for a child in school or 6 monthly for a pre-school child.

TUF – Top-up Funding – can be allocated for school aged children if the child's needs are significant and long term. This funding is usually given until the end of the Foundation Stage.

DLA - Disability Living Allowance - DLA is given by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) to children who need a high level of additional support to carry out daily activities

DAF – Disability Access Funding - DAF is available to children who are 3 or 4, who receive DLA and are included in FEEE funded settings. If eligible, £615 is given annually to promote inclusion. Settings apply for DAF through the parental statement of undertaking form (PSOU). Where children attend two settings, the parent chooses which setting applies for the funding

Targeted Plan – this plan records the work undertaken to support the child through the assess, plan, do, review cycle. Targeted plans should be written in conjunction with the parents and focus on areas which need support. Targeted plans record work undertaken and progress made by the child as a result of the intervention.

PEP – Personal Education Plan - PEPs are used to support children in care (CIC) and they are drawn up with the virtual school, foster carer and the setting SENCO/designated key person, if the child attends a setting.

Specialist Teaching Services

The Local Authority has several services to support children with SEND and their families:

1) **Autism Outreach Team** (AOT) supports school aged children with a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

2) **Vision Support Team** (VST) supports early years and school aged children with a visual impairment.

3) **Hearing Support Team** (HST) supports early years and school aged children with a hearing impairment.

4) **ICT Assessment Team** (ICTAT) considers adaptations and technological support to aid children's learning and communication at school

Early Years' Services for children 0-5

Early Years SEND Inclusion Team (EYSENIT) is a county wide team of teachers and practitioners who work with children with a range of SEND either at home or in their settings

Improvement Advisors and Area SENCOs support early years' settings through the Area SENCO role. Area SENCOs give advice to setting SENCOs about ways to support young children with SEND and they help to support the early identification of children in settings

Early Years Communication and Interaction Team (EYCIT) consists of teachers and practitioners who support children who have a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder or are on the Autism Pathway. Support is given at home and in early years settings

Portage Home Visiting Service is a service for babies and very young children (0-2 ½ years) with significant learning difficulties or complex needs. The service is part of the EYSENIT and the National Portage Association. The Service employs Portage Home Visitors who work with parents within their home. Portage is based on the principle that parents are the key figures in the care and development of their child.

Early Years Inclusion Team is made up of a team of 5 practitioners who support children in early years' settings and schools (until child is statutory school age). They support children who are at risk of exclusion.

All Early Years teams are based at County Hall and can be contacted on **0116 305 7136**. The Duty Desk operates on the above number daily from 9am-4.45pm. The advice line is manned by Area SENCOs who offer unnamed advice and general support.

Referrals to the team are considered at the **Early Years' Panel** which meets weekly. Referral forms can be found on the <u>website</u>

Leicestershire Psychology Service

Educational Psychologists (EPs) may be allocated to individual children at the Early Years' Panel. They give advice and support to parents/carers and Early Years SENCOs. EPs are involved in the assessment of children's needs and support transition to educational placements. This service can be contacted on 0116 305 5100

Special Educational Needs Assessment Service – SENA

SENA oversees the statutory assessment of children with SEND either through Topup Funding or through an Education, Health and Care Plan.

STEPS

STEPS is a registered charity which provides specialist nursery services and support to children with motor disorders and their families, enabling them to lead fuller, more active lives. The centre is based in Shepshed and sessions are run daily. For further information call 01509 506878

Birstall Special Needs Playgroup

This playgroup opens on Monday and Fridays from 9.30-11.30 at Birstall Methodist Church and caters for children aged 6 weeks to 4 with SEN and disabilities. Specialist maintained nurseries – in Leicestershire we have two nursery settings which cater for children from 2-5 with significant SEND. These are: -

To gain a place at the Menphys nurseries, children need to be referred to a specialist panel which meets 6 times a year.

Beacon Nursery in Loughborough is a mainstream nursery, but some specialist places are allocated to children with SEND - Call 01509 264876

Oasis Retreat Pre-school is based in Melton Mowbray and it offers up to 10 specialist places for children with SEND - Call 01664 500424

Information about Health Services and support to setting SENCOs

Public Health Nurses (previously Health Visitors)

Every child will have a named Public Health Nurse. If parents do not know the name of the Public Health Nurse this information can be obtained from the child's Doctors' surgery.

Every Early Years Setting also has a named Public Health Nurse.

Public Health Nurses have a wide remit which includes giving advice on speech and language development, child development, behaviour support, liaison with preschool settings and referrals to other health services.

Speech and Language Therapists

Often abbreviated to SALT or SLT. Speech therapists support children's communication skills which includes expressive language, receptive language (understanding), social communication, eating and drinking issues and stammering (dysfluency).

Referral to the Speech and Language Therapy Service depends on the child's age

- For children with a general delay who are between the ages of 2-3- children and parents are invited to attend a series of 6 workshops called Let's Get Talking. Health Visitors refer children to these groups.
- For children over 3 or those with a significant condition which affects communication or eating and drinking issues, a direct referral to the Speech and Language Therapy Service can be made using the Family, Children and Young People Referral form which can be found at www.leicspart.nhs.uk.
