COVID-19 Testing for Care Home Staff and Residents

1. Routine Testing




As of 31 August 2022, routine asymptomatic testing for COVID-19 is **no longer required for care home staff or residents.**

2. Symptomatic Testing



Staff or residents that have symptoms of a respiratory infection and have a high temperature **OR** who have symptoms of a respiratory infection and are too unwell to carry out their usual activities should take a **lateral flow test as soon as they feel unwell** (Day 0).




3. Outbreak Testing



If two or more positive or suspected linked cases of COVID-19 occur in the same setting within a 14-day period, the home is then considered to be in outbreak and outbreak testing begins.

*PCR tests should only be taken by staff or residents that have not tested positive within the last 90 days.



10 days after last positive test

All staff and residents take PCR test 10 days after last positive test.



Apart from those tested positive in the last 90 days, all staff and residents should do a PCR test at least 10 days after the last case of COVID-19 in the care home.

If all results return negative, outbreak restrictions can be lifted.

5. What to do in the event of a positive result?
