Keynote Speaker - Stuart Guest

Stuart is an experienced head teacher of eleven + years and father to three children: one birth child and two through adoption.

He has developed trauma friendly approaches at his school and has seen the positive impact this can have on pupils, families, staff and outcomes for his school.

Stuart trains schools and gives talks and interviews about education in relation to children who are adopted, have attachment difficulties or experienced trauma or adverse childhood experiences. He also delivers college and university lectures. His aim through these talks and training is to raise the awareness of schools to trauma issues and how this affects children's behaviour and how schools can adapt their policies and procedures to become attachment aware. He also aims to help and support parents navigate the complicated and ever changing educational landscape.

Stuart has had a number of articles published in the Adoption Today magazine and has appeared on the BBC One Show in January 2018 and the Victoria Derbyshire Show in June 2018 talking about support for adopted children in schools.
