- Teachers from BAME backgrounds who are facing some perceived barriers to career progression who wish to learn from others about how to be successful.

About the Programme



This 4-day programme taking place between February and June 2020 is designed for any BAME teacher who aspires to be a leader. Each session will cover a number of topics and will be highly participative and reflective with a focus on self-awareness, motivation and ambition in order to increase individual resilience and confidence. The face to face sessions will be enhanced by gap tasks and coaching.

The programme will explore BAME statistics and evidence in education to understand what is stopping BAME teachers progressing to become leaders in schools. It will also aim to identify the structural and cultural barriers to progression and provide suggestions as to how these can be overcome.

The programme will encourage participants to reflect on their own professional identities and career journeys with a focus on planning for the future. Sessions will cover how to choose the 'right' employer, recruitment processes, equal opportunities, how to prepare for promotion and make the best choices for success.

In addition, there will be several guest speakers who will share their professional journeys and the steps they took to achieve their leadership positions. There will also be opportunities for participants to shape the content of the programme by suggesting areas they wish to cover when they apply.
