Businesses suffering skills shortages as recruitment difficulties

worsen: Almost three-quarters of business who attempted to recruit faced difficulties in Q3, rising 9% compared with Q2, a new report reveals as skills shortages worsen.

The latest 'Quarterly Recruitment Outlook' from the British Chambers of Commerce (BCC) reveals that skills shortages were predominantly felt across skilled manual roles and professional

roles with 80% of construction firms and 71% of transport and distribution businesses facing difficulties recruiting the right staff.

In the run up to Christmas, 70,000 transport and distribution roles were advertised on Totaljobs in Q3, receiving an average of 23 applications per vacancy.


Despite concerns over Brexit deadlock, labour market performance and expectations are holding up fairly well. Only 11% of businesses have decreased their workforce in Q3, with one in four businesses increasing their total headcount. Headcount remained consistent at 62% of responding businesses.

Looking forward, one in four businesses plan to increase their headcount in Q4 2019, and two in three expect to keep their workforce consistent. Just 8% of UK firms expect to decrease their headcount in Q4 2019.

Sector Trends



1 in 2 UK engineering and tech firms are concerned that a shortage of engineers is a business threat: Demand for engineers continues to rise, but 60% of

employers report recruitment of engineering and technical staff with the right skills as the biggest anticipated barrier to achieving their business objectives over the next three years. This is according to the 2019 Skills and Demand in Industry report, published today (18th Nov) by the Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET).

The report also highlights that nearly half of companies (48%) report difficulties in respect of the skills available in the external labour market when trying to recruit, with only 20% expecting the supply of engineering and technical skills into industry to improve over the next 3-5 years.

From a positive perspective, almost one in three employers (31%) said they have expanded their engineering and technology workforce over the last three years and fewer companies now have internal skills gaps when compared with two years ago (22% compared to 25% in 2017).

However, those companies with internal skills gaps have seen them widen across the board, from apprentices and trainees through to fully-qualified professionals. 48% report gaps in the skills of their apprentices or other young trainees – which is up from 30% in 2017.

45% of employers value

academic and technical qualifications equally: 84% of firms are expecting to maintain or increase investment in training their workforce, according to the 2019 CBI/Pearson Education and Skills Annual Report.

Latest data shows that UK employers spent £44.2 billion on training in 2017.

The report 'Education and learning for the modern world' surveys 208 businesses and trade associations.

It reveals that 45% of respondents value all qualifications equally – with 29% looking for a mix of academic and technical education post-16. This includes academic (A-Levels), career-focused (such as BTEC) and occupational (apprenticeships and T Levels).

In addition, more than four in five businesses polled (86%) now offer apprenticeship programmes. 63% say they plan to expand their apprenticeship training in the future and 54% have created new schemes.

Yet more than one in four firms (26%) are simply absorbing the cost of the Apprenticeship Levy as a tax on doing business. Seven in ten firms (71%) that responded highlighted apprenticeship reform as their biggest priority.

Businesses are increasingly aware of the T Level reforms, with 79% of respondents actively aware of the new qualification. 77% were aware of the work placement element – up from 35% last year.

Disabled workers suffer pay penalty: Disabled employees are paid 12.2% less than their non-disabled peers, according to official data.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) found that in 2018 the median pay for non-disabled workers was £12.11 an hour, against £10.63 for disabled.

London had the widest disability pay gap at 15.3%, with the narrowest in Scotland, at 8.3%.

The gap was the widest for those in their 30s and 40s, the ONS said in its report.

The data underlines the struggle facing many disabled workers, the Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD) said.



Skills-OVATE: Skills-OVATE (Skills online vacancy analysis tool for Europe) draws on the huge potential for using big data and machine learning techniques with vacancy information.

Many millions of job vacancies from 18 EU countries (including the UK) were analysed to produce 'word clouds' on skills associated with specific occupations, interactive graphics on geographical spread of opportunities, the incidence of occupations within industrial sectors, and more.

It's worth setting aside just a bit of time to explore the potential of the site, which then can serve both your own needs and as a tool for clients, though it would best suit people who are fairly literate and tech-competent.

Green light for Derbyshire retail and industrial scheme which will create over 1,000 jobs: Plans for the final phase of a major scheme on the Derbyshire/Nottinghamshire border which would create more than 1,000 jobs have been given the green light.

Park 38, off Cartwright Lane, opposite the East Midlands Designer Outlet at South Normanton, is a mixed used development, which would see a new £46 million retail park created on farmland, as well as a hotel and industrial/distribution units.

Bolsover District Council has already approved the first phase of the scheme for 10 retail units and a 95-bedroom hotel.

£450k boost for Fenwick revamp plans: Plans for a major revamp of Leicester's historic former Fenwick building are set to get a boost with £450,000 of council investment for a new flexible workspace.

Leicester City Council has announced plans to create almost 12,000sqft of flexible co-working business workspace in part of the ground floor and basement of the 1880s-built four-storey property in Market Street.

The investment will support and complement Aimrok Holdings' £17million plans for the building which will see it converted into a 121-bedroom aparthotel, including a hotel lobby bar, restaurant and gym facilities, together with a series of ground floor and basement

Civil engineering firm to create 180 jobs: Some 180 jobs are set to be created after Balfour Beatty Living Places revealed it has won a £217m contract to provide road maintenance to Lincolnshire County Council.

Balfour Beatty Living places will work with the Council to provide the maintenance of 9,000 km of highways, carriageways and footpaths.

Balfour Beatty says it will hire 90% of the workforce from the local area and create 63 apprenticeships and 24 graduate placements.
